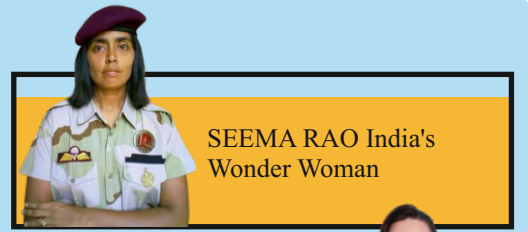
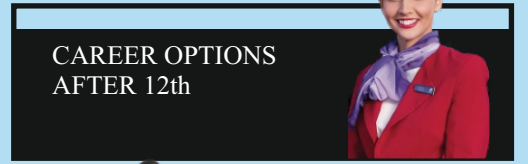

Uproar over Farmer's Bills



Rise in petrol and diesel prices stopped fluctuating due to the ongoing assembly elections.



Due to the Assembly elections in four states and one union territory, the rising petrol and diesel prices in India have stopped fluctuating. Fuel prices got frozen on February 27, exactly a month before March 27, when the polling will begin. Union Petroleum Minister Dharmendra Pradhan said in parliament on March 8th, 2021 that prices of petrol and diesel had been made market determined, and thus, public sector oil marketing companies (OMCs) took appropriate decision on pricing. The factor in international product prices, exchange rate, tax structure, inland freight and other cost elements, he added. She was also awarded by the President of India with the First Ladies' Award in 2018 and was also featured among the country's top 100 women achievers. Ayesha Aziz is now rising as a role model for every Indian girl who wanted to pursue their dreams and wanted to make an impact in the male dominated society.

Mamata Banerjee alleges conspiracy as she suffers from leg injury

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee suffered left leg injuries while campaigning at Nandigram and was immediately taken to Kolkata for treatment. Ms Banerjee alleged that four or five persons surrounded and pushed her while she was greeting people. At the time of incident, there was no local police personnel and even the Police Superintendent was not present there. I was in pain and had to return to Kolkata, Ms Banerjee told journalists. She was asked whether it was a conspiracy or not, she told, "It is a conspiracy, they did it purposely".

The Chief Minister was admitted to SSKM hospital in Kolkata and taken inside on a stretcher. She was returning from a religious event at Reyapara in Nandigram where she lived temporarily. According to reports, as soon as she stepped out of the car to greet people, few unknown people pushed her to the door and forcibly shut down the door which resulted in the injuries on her left leg and pain in the

waist. Sukhendu Shekhar Ray, Trinamool Congress MP who accompanied Ms Banerjee said, the incident occurred at Birulia Anchal in Nandigram. Trinamool Congress MP Abhishek Banerjee and other family members were present at the hospital.

A large number of TMC supporters gathered outside the hospital and raised slogans against BJP. Governor Mr. Jagdeep Dhankar was shouted "go back" slogans by the TMC supporters. While some BJP leaders wished her a speedy recovery and others such as Kailash Vijayvargiya, Arjun Singh and State Congress President Adhir Chowdhury said she was trying to gain sympathy out of the incident.

Leaders of several political parties like Rashtriya Janata Dal leader Tejashvi Yadav, Samajwadi Party leader Akhilesh Yadav and Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal raised questions on the incident that took place with the Chief Minister of West Bengal.

Delhi Government all set to revolutionize education through Delhi Board of School Education



Mr. Arvind Kejriwal, The Chief Minister of Delhi has announced the creation of new 'Delhi Board of School Education (DBSE)'. This is not only going to bring the revolutionary changes in the curriculum for students but will also take the education system to greater heights. There are about 1000 Government schools and 1500 private schools under CBSE. Delhi Government has said to include only 20-25 Government schools under Delhi board in the upcoming academic session (2021-22). Schools will be selected only after the brief discussion with teachers, principals and parents. The Delhi Government hopes to

see schools voluntarily getting affiliated to Delhi Board of School Education within 4-5 years.

Every year, the Delhi Government includes around 25% on education in the state budget for the betterment of facilities in schools. Also, the government sends school teachers and principals to US and Finland for training programmes in order to bring the best teaching experience to students. Delhi Board of School Education will be chaired by the Education Minister of Delhi and an Executive Body for the day to day functioning of schools which will be headed by a CEO.

Tirath Singh Rawat sworn in as New CM of Uttarakhand



BJP MP Tirath Singh Rawat was sworn in as the new Chief Minister of Uttarakhand, a day after the resignation of Trivendra Singh Rawat, who stepped down from the CM post after completing nearly 4 years in office. A year ahead of assembly elections in the state, Trivendra Singh Rawat was asked by the BJP to step down. The name of Tirath Singh Rawat, who represents Pauri Garhwal in Lok Sabha, was announced after a meeting of the BJP legislative body. Over 50 BJP MLAs gathered in the party - state headquarters

in Dehradun along with Parliamentarians including Union Education Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank, Ajay Bhatt, Mala Rajya Lakshmi, and Naresh Bansal. Following the party norms, former CM Trivendra Singh Rawat proposed the name of Tirath for the post of CM and it was supported by all the party MLAs and MPs, who were present. Asked about the reason for his resignation, Rawat said: "Yeh samuhik nirnay hota hai aur iska bahut acche jawab ke liye Delhi Jaana padega (A collective decision is made. And for an appropriate answer, you will have to go to Delhi). Tirath is among the prominent faces of the party for the 2022 assembly elections in Uttarakhand. "I am grateful to the Prime Minister and BJP for giving me this opportunity. I will make my best effort to live up to their expectations. I will continue the positive works done by Trivendra Singh Rawat in the last four years", said Tirath.

India's Retail Inflation rises in February.



India's retail inflation probably rose in February as food and fuel prices went up, but remained within the Reserve Bank of India's target range for a third straight month, a Reuters poll predicted. The March 5-9 poll of over 50 economists showed retail inflation climbed to 4.83 percent in February from January's 4.06 percent. "What's more, retail food price data point to a significant rebound in food inflation" No contributor expected retail inflation to rise above the RBI's upper limit of 6.0 percent even though Brent crude oil prices have reached highs

notseen since the pandemic began. Forecasts ranged between 3.80 per cent and 5.40 per cent.

The minutes of the RBI Monetary Policy Committee's February meeting showed members raised concerns about upside risks to inflation, but the bank kept its reperate at a record low 4.0 per cent, saying it would ensure ample liquidity. But despite that liquidity assurance Indian bond yields have surged, mirroring global yields as inflation expectations rise on an improved outlook for the global recovery.

PM inaugurates "Maitri Setu" between India and Bangladesh



Prime Minister Narendra Modi, with eyeing to further strengthen the friendly ties between India and Bangladesh virtually inaugurated the 1.9-km-long 'MaitriSetu' or the India-Bangladesh Friendship Bridge, built over Feni river that connects Sabroom district in south Tripura to Ramgarh in Bangladesh along with other infrastructural projects in Tripura. "This connectivity has not only strengthened the friendship between India and Bangladesh but also proved to be a strong link of business too" PM Modi said while inaugurating the bridge virtually.

"The entire region is being developed as a trade corridor between northeast India and Bangladesh," he further added. The bridge not only symbolizes the growing bilateral relations and friendly ties between India and Bangladesh. But a new trade corridor and people-to- people movement between India and Bangladesh. The construction of the bridge has been overseen by National Highways and Infrastructure

Development Corporation Ltd, a government-owned company under the road transport and highways ministry. The bridge connects Sabroom in Tripura to Ramgarh in Bangladesh. From Ramgarh, vehicles can travel by road to Chittagong port, which is approximately 80 km away. Alternatively, from Ramgarh, one can use the waterways to transport goods to Chittagong port.

Also makes Tripuracapital Agartala one of the Indian cities located closest toan international seaport, unlocking untapped markets of other east and southeast economies.

The Maitri bridge ,the "gateway of Northeast", will be the fastest land route. Prime Minister Modi also laid the foundation stone for setting up an integrated check post at Sabroom which will help in easing the movement of goods and passengers between India and Bangladesh. The project has an estimated cost of about 232 crores, according to PMO's statement.

Quad Leaders call for free and open Indo-Pacific region India to produce billion vaccines by 2022



New Delhi: During the first Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (Quad), the four leaders-the US, Australia, India and Japan-called for a free, open and rule-based Indo-Pacific region that is "anchored by democratic values, and unconstrained by coercion". Speaking at the Summit, Prime Minister Narender Modi called Quad an important pillar of stability in the Indo-Pacific region. The Quad leaders also committed to holding an in-person leader's summit by the end of 2021. India's formidable vaccine production capacity was also acknowledged after

Quad nations agreed to pool their financial resources, manufacturing capabilities and logical strengths to produce the COVID-19 vaccine for distribution in the Indo-Pacific region. US COVID-19 vaccines will be manufactured in India for distribution in the Indo-Pacific region which would be financed by the US and Japan with logistic support from Australia. Under this initiative, India would produce one billion COVID-19 vaccines by 2022.

Uproar over Farmer's Bills



The three bills that were passed are the Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Bill, Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill and Essential Commodities (Amendment) Bill. There has been an uproar after the Parliament passed three agriculture related bills. The government said the bills would boost the sector of agriculture. This will also raise the income of farmers, the centre said. In fact, by 2022, the government had also promised double farmers income, and the Centre said the Bills will make the farmers stable of government-controlled markets and bring them a better price for their goods. The Bills propose the establishment of a scheme in which farmers and traders may sell their goods outside the Mandis. In addition, it also encourages intra-state trade and this implies reducing transport costs, the Bill offers a basis for agreements that enable farmers to engage with agri-business companies, retailers, service exporters and the selling of produce while giving farmers access to modern technology. It also provides benefits to small and marginal farmers with a land area of less than five hectares. The Bill would also delete commodities from the list of important goods such as cereals and pulses and attract FDI. Farmers were apprehensive about the Bill. They say they are apprehensive about getting their product's minimum support price. They are also worried about the upper hand in negotiations between agri-businesses and big retailers. They feel that this will place them at a disadvantage. They also suggest that the price will be dictated by the companies and the benefits for small farmers will decrease the sponsors' engagement with them.

The government has repeatedly claimed that these bills would revolutionise the lives of Indian farmers, saying "MSP was, MSP is, and MSP would continue in the future. It also asserted that these bills would allow farmers to link with large traders and exporters, bringing agricultural benefit.

The Union Minister for Agriculture has also said that these bills would not affect the APMC Act of the State. "APMC will be within the state, but there will be inter-state trade beyond its periphery, and farmers will still be able to sell their goods from their fields, their homes, and elsewhere after the legislation comes into use."

Pros:
The government said that the bills would transform the agriculture sector. It would also raise the farmers' income, the Centre said. Further the government had also promised double farmers' income by 2022 and the Centre said that the Bills will make the farmer independent of government controlled markets and fetch them a better price for their produce. The Bills propose to create a system in which the farmers and traders can sell their purchase outside the Mandis. Further it also encourage intra-state trade and this proposes to reduce the cost of transportation. Further the Bill formulates a framework on the agreements that enable farmers to engage with agri-business companies, retailers, exporters for service and sale of produce while giving the farmer access to modern technology. It also provides benefits for the small and marginal farmers with less than five hectares of land. The Bill also will remove items such as cereals and pulses form the list of essential commodities and attract FDI. According to the government, the recently passed bills for farmers will help in transforming the agriculture sector as these are believed to increase the farmer's income. The Centre believes that the people engaged in farming will become independent and can get better prices for their products.

Cons:
The farmers have been apprehensive about this Bill. They say that they are apprehensive about getting Minimum Support Price for their produce. They are also concerned about the upper hand of the agri-businesses and big retailers in negotiations. They feel this would put them at a disadvantage. They also say that the companies may dictate the price and the benefits for small farmers may reduce the engagement of sponsors with them. The bill passed for farmers to allow trade of crops outside the government regulated mandis or markets thus hampering the monopoly of the agricultural produce market committee. MSP for crops has been declared by the government but in the Promotion and Facilitation Bill 2020, there is no statutory backing to MSP. There is no mention of this in the entire bill and this is what concerns the people the most as they do not have anything to do with the legal system but MSP matters to them.

PRATIMA PURI was a female Indian TV News Anchor who worked as Doordarshan's First News Reader. The station went on air in 1959. Pratima Puri was gifted with a voice that was made for broadcasting, which worked out very well for her career at the All India Radio. Later, when the Indian government decided to run channel of its own. Puri was selected as a News Announcer. On September 15, 1959, with a small transmitter and a

makeshift studio Doordarshan or (DD) was to make its debut as it started its experimental telecast in Delhi. The telecast was a five minutes news bulletin and Pratima Puri was chosen to be the first newsreader of India. Pratima Puri passed away in 2007 but is remembered for paving the way for other women who wanted to follow the same path and is undoubtedly an inspiration for all women broadcasters.



BHAWANA KANTH became the first woman fighter pilot to take part in the Republic Day parade this year. She is currently posted at an Airbase in Rajasthan where she flies the MiG-21 Bison fighter plane. Kanth is also one of the first women fighter pilots in the Indian Air Force. She, along with Avani Chaturvedi and Mohana Singh, was inducted into the IAF as the first women fighter pilots in 2016. After the government of India decided to open the

fighter stream in India Air Force for women on an experimental basis, these three women were the first to be selected for the program. Kanth completed her schooling from DAV Public School, Barauni. She prepared for engineering entrance examination in Kota Rajasthan. Kanth joined Bachelor of Engineering in Medical Electronics from BMS College of engineering Bengaluru for further studies.



SEEMA RAO known as India's Wonder Woman, is India's First Woman Commando Trainer having trained Special Forces of India for over two decades without compensation. Born to an Indian freedom fighter, professor Ramakant Sinari Rao, has an MBA in Crisis Management. She was Ms. India World Beauty Pageant finalist. She is India's first woman commando trainer over 20,000 soldiers from Indian Armed Forces, paramilitary and police, Seema has received three army chief citations, a commendable record.

She is a combat shooting instructor an army mountaineering Institute, HMI medalist and an 8th degree black belt in military martial arts. She co-invented a new method of shooting called the Rao system of reflex fire for close quarters combat with her husband Deepak Rao. She has authored several books the world's first encyclopedia of close combat operations and used her life's earnings to gift 1000 copies of the book to the home ministry and Indian Army. Pursuing an

education in medicine, she certified as a doctor in conventional medicine. She was born in a patriotic setting, her father professor Ramakant Sinari was a freedom fighter.

She went on to train military martial arts, kravmaga and mixed Martial arts. She along with her husband conducted various training programmes in unarmed and armed combat and shooting for police, state Police, para-military, armed forces, Special Forces and the national security guards black cat commandos. She along with her husband created DARE (Defense against Rape and Eve teasing) programme for women to deal with offence like sexual harassment, sexual assault etc. Dr. Seema Rao showed her creativity in directing, writing, editing in her movie titled, "hathapayi" bringing reality action and mixed martial to the silver screen. She also produced music and lent her voice for the movie soundtrack. The movie won the prestigious Dadasaheb Phalke Film Festival Jury Award for 2015.



KIRAN MAZUMDAR SHAW is a billionaire entrepreneur. She was born on 23rd March in 1953 in Pune. She is the Chairperson and Managing Director of Biocon Limited, a Biotechnology company based in Bangalore, India and the former Chairperson of Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore. She is on the Financial Times, top 50 women in business list. She was named EY world Entrepreneur of the year 2020. She was educated at Bangalore's Bishop Cotton Girl's High School. She then attended Mount Carmel College, Bangalore. She studied Biology and Zoology and earned Bachelor's Degree in Zoology in 1973 from Bangalore University. 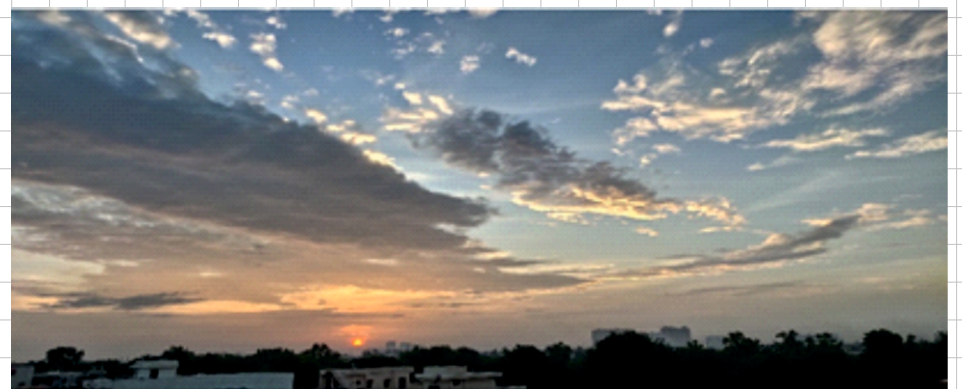
